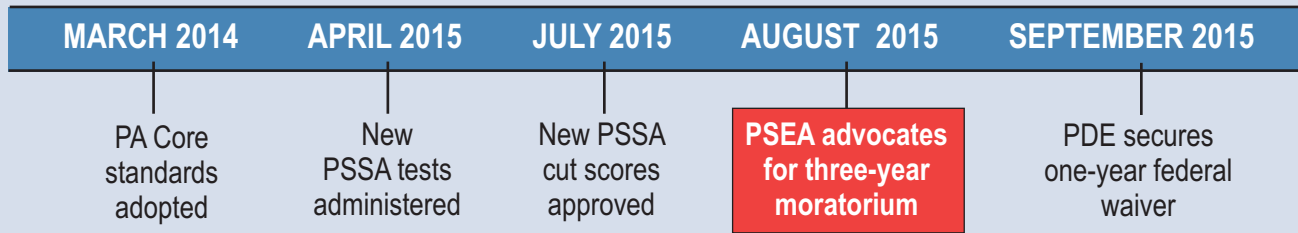
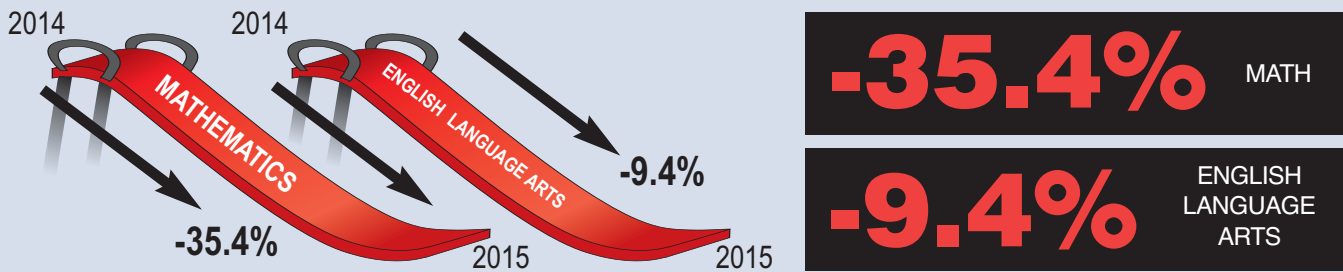


New standards, PSSAs, and cut scores

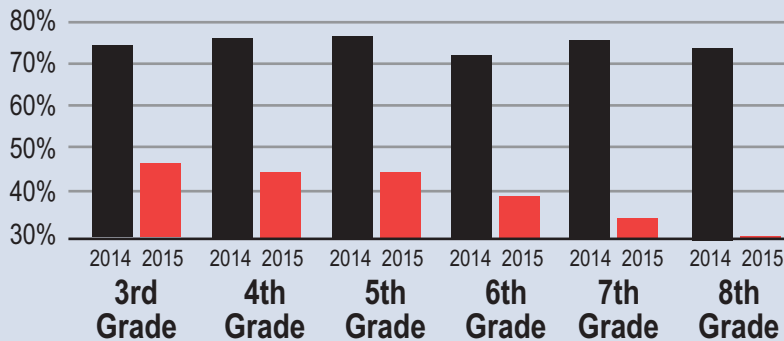
The breakneck pace of testing changes: A timeline



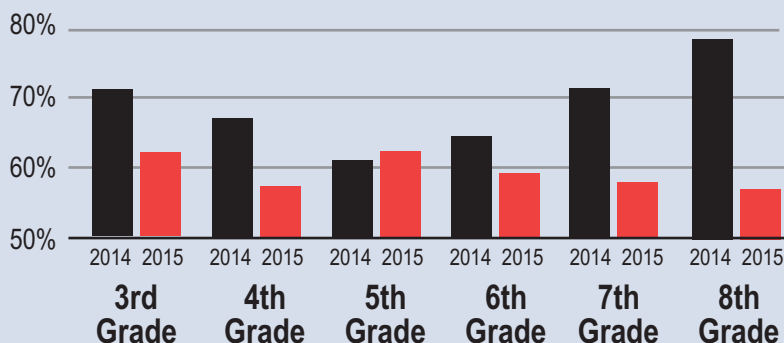
On average, the percentage of students scoring "proficient" or "advanced" on the new PSSAs is lower than on previous PSSAs.



Math proficiency rates lower across all grades

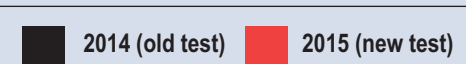


ELA proficiency rates lower across most grade levels
